

Scout Sunday

The Boy Scouts of America designates the Sunday that falls before February 8 (Scouting Anniversary Day) as Scout Sunday, which is the primary date to recognize the contributions of young people and adults to Scouting.

However, each chartered organization can use either of two other options to celebrate this special day. An organization can adopt a specific Sunday to celebrate. In the instance of the United Methodist Church, Scout Sunday is celebrated on the second Sunday in February. It also is permissible for a local church to celebrate on the Sunday most acceptable to the pastor and congregation.

What can Ceremonies do?

- Communicate something significant is taking place
- Accentuate an event or accomplishment
- Entertain
- Provide inspiration

What are the keys to a good ceremony?

- Preparation
- Staging
- Group Dynamics



Preparation

- It's always much better to deliver a ceremony from the heart, without reading lines.
- If lines must be read, or parts are meant to be read, in order to avoid awkward moments, the presenter should practice them. **Do not hand out scripts at time of event**
- Presenters often mistakenly assume that if they can hear themselves talk, the people in the back row can, too. If microphones are needed, get them and use them.
- It's also easy to assume that someone else is bringing essential props. Double check that everything is ready to go well prior to the actual presentation.
- When more than one presenter will be involved, acting out different parts, or assuming special roles, it's just good practice to schedule some run-throughs.



Staging

- Scouts are always prepared. All props, materials, microphones, projectors, and visual aids should be ready and properly positioned prior to the presentation.
- Lighting should be checked and any helpers briefed and ready.
- If there will be any special activity, presenters should be acquainted with where they will need to be, what they need to do and when they need to do it.



Group Dynamics

- Position seating or adjust the setting to assure everyone in attendance will be able to see and hear what's taking place, so they can enjoy and appreciate the presentation.
- If individuals will need to know where to stand during an elaborate ceremony, tape their "mark" on the floor.

2022 OA Unit Election Overview



What are Order of the Arrow Unit Elections

- Order of the Arrow Unit Elections are a time for the Unit to to honor those youth who bestow the ideals of the Scout Oath and Law by the unit youth voting on who they feel are worthy.
- This is also a time for the Lodge Election Team to come to the local units and explain what the Order of the Arrow is and the benefits it can provide both the youth and adults of the unit.



Order of the Arrow Eligibility - Youth

- Be nominated by the Scoutmaster, Adviser, or Skipper.
- Be under the age of 21, and a registered scouter.
- Obtain the rank of First Class, Discovery, or Ordinary Rank. (With the Unit nominating)
- Complete 15 nights of camping one of which must be a long term (5 nights consecutive). (With the Unit nominating)



What is the Process

- Elections start with an email from the lodge to the SM/AD/SK and CC of each known unit.
 - If a Unit leader does not receive an email already please email elections@erielhonan,org
- The SM/AD/SK determines if there are eligible youth for nomination.
- The SM/AD/SK will utilize the link in the email sent to request a unit election or decline.



What is the Process

- Once the form is submitted one of two things will happen:
 - If an election is requested a request for information will be emailed to the SM/AD/SK.
 - This request will be for basic information on the nominated scouts to prepare the Unit Election Paperwork.
 - If no election is requested the SM/AD/SK will receive an email thanking them for completing the request and some basic information on the upcoming lodges schedule to share with their unit.



What is the Process

- On the scheduled date the Unit Election Team will arrive at the location and:
 - Give a short presentation on the Order of the Arrow and the Election Process.
- Votes will be tallied with the Election team and an Adult from the Unit (typically the SM/AD/SK).
- The SM/AD/SK will determine if the results are announced at that time or be held until a later date.



Points of Note

- The Erielhonan Lodge Election season is from 30 January to 07 May 2022.
 - No elections will be granted outside of this timeframe
- All elections must be conducted by a **Lodge Election Team**.
 - Elections conducted by individual units will not be honored.
- The youth of the unit are the only individuals with the ability to vote.
 - If the SM/AD/SK is not satisfied with the vote they may not tip the scale for or against a youth on the ballot.



Adult Nominations

- Adult nominations do not occur until after the Unit has conducted their election.
- After conducting the election the CC will receive an email from the election committee informing them the total nominations, they have available.



Adult Nominations

- A link will be provided to the CC which will allow for the submission of Adult Nominations.
- Adult nomination requirements are the same as the youth requirements with the exception of the rank requirement.
