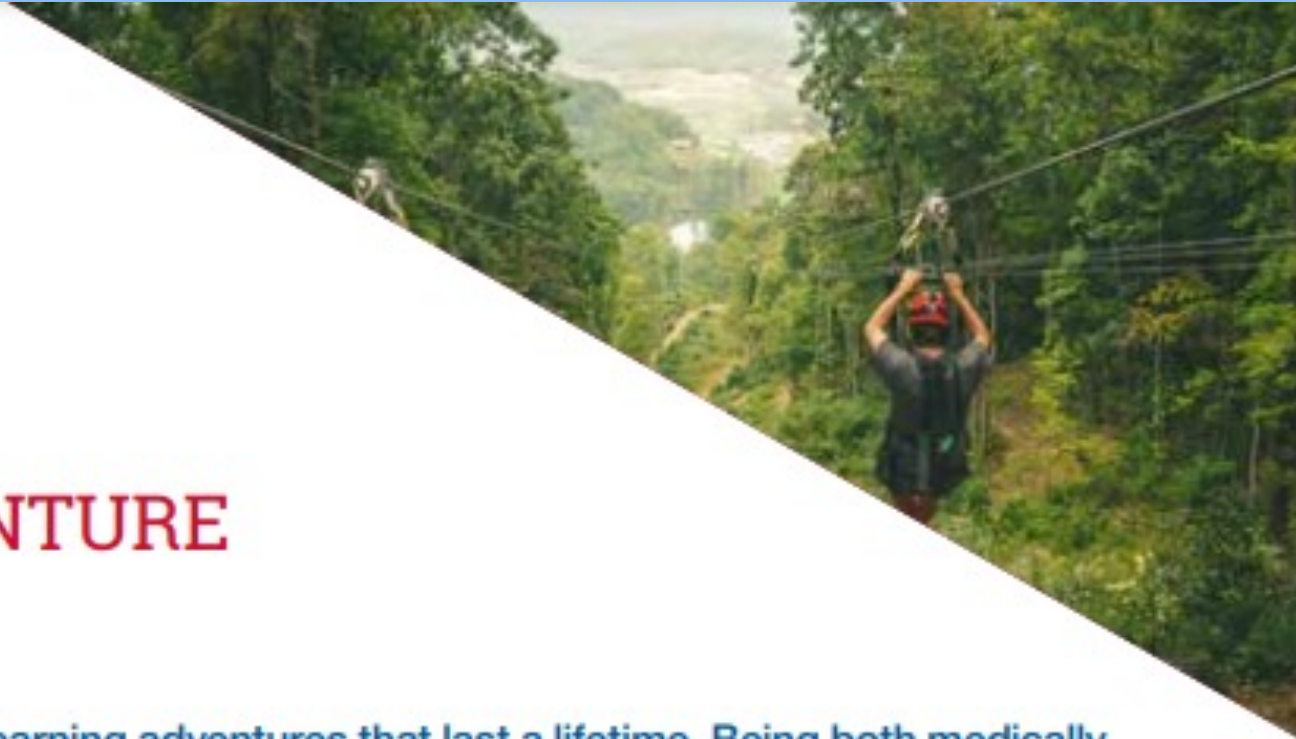
## BSA SAFETY MOMENT

### BE PREPARED FOR HIGH ADVENTURE

#### SUMMARY

High-adventure trips are intended to deliver wilderness and learning adventures that last a lifetime. Being both medically and physically prepared for these trips will help ensure they are as safe and enjoyable as they are memorable. While this is true for all Scouts, it is especially critical for adult leaders to be prepared!

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# Safety Moment

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- High-adventure trips are physically demanding and have inherent risks, and each crew member needs to understand how to mitigate these risks. Part of this process is ensuring that each crew member has identified any medical issues that may place either the crew member or the crew at an increased risk of a medical emergency while on the trip.
- The first step is to complete the three parts of the BSA Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR). You must meet with a licensed health care provider (e.g., M.D., D.O., N.P., or P.A.) to complete Part C of the Record. Be sure you and your provider have read the “High-Adventure Risk Advisory” section of the AHMR so everyone fully understands the known health risks associated with the high adventure.
- Have an honest and open conversation with your provider about whether it is appropriate for you to go on the trip. The physical demands vary by high-adventure activity, but the presence of any of several medical risk factors can raise concerns. While the list is not all-inclusive, the following are important factors: excessive body weight, history of heart or cardiovascular diseases, high blood pressure, diabetes, seizures (epilepsy), asthma, allergies or anaphylaxis, ingrown toenails, recent musculoskeletal injuries, orthopedic surgery, and psychological or emotional difficulties.
- If it's medically appropriate for you to go, the second step is to be sure you are physically fit enough to meet the challenges of high adventure. Being fit will greatly enhance your enjoyment of the trip! Most high-adventure trips require a combination of cardiorespiratory fitness, muscular endurance, and muscular strength. Can you walk three miles in an hour without stopping? Pass the BSA swim test? Do 10 push-ups? Go up three flights of stairs without your legs tiring? If not, then you would benefit from improving your fitness.
- A simple way to increase your fitness is to complete the [SCOUTStrong Presidential Lifestyle Award Challenge](#). The challenge is designed to help participants become more active while also eating healthier.

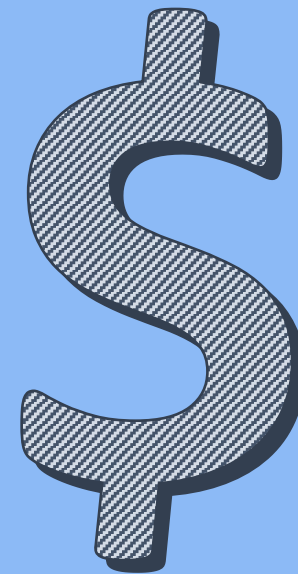

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# Planning an Adventure

**Guide to Safe Scouting: Transportation** General guidelines are as follows:

It is essential to have safe and responsible transportation for all Scouting activities.

**When possible, use public carriers**—for example, trains, buses, and commercial airlines for group travel.

Drivers are expected to **follow all applicable traffic laws** and not drive if impaired or distracted—for example texting, while driving All drivers must have a **valid**

**Driver's license** that has not been suspended or revoked, including a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) when required.

**Youth drivers are prohibited.** Must be 18 years of age or older.



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# Planning an Adventure

Guide to Safe Scouting: Transportation

Must **meet Scouting's Barriers to Abuse** Supervision requirements, including two-deep leadership and no one-on-one during transportation.

Driving time is limited to a **maximum of 10 hours in one 24-hour period**, regardless of drivers available. Frequent breaks are required, including rest, food, and recreation. Do not drive when distracted or drowsy.

The use of **private aviation for transportation is prohibited**.

Motor vehicles used to transport Scouts **must complete Pre-Trip Transportation Inspection** before travel. This includes correcting all deficiencies.

All occupants **must wear factory-installed seatbelts**. This includes the use of appropriate car seats for youth.



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# Planning an Adventure

Guide to Safe Scouting: Transportation

Transportation of passengers in a **pickup or truck bed**, recreational camper or towed trailer is **prohibited**. See limited [exception](#) for parade and hayrides.

The use of **15-passenger vans manufactured before 2005** is prohibited.

All vehicles must be covered by **automobile liability insurance** with limits that meet or exceed the requirements of the state in which the vehicle is licensed. It is recommended, however, that coverage limits are at least \$100,000 combined single limit. Any vehicle designed to carry ten or more passengers

should have limit of \$1,000,000. For insurance information refer to the Insurance section in the *Guide to Safe Scouting*.

When towing the tow vehicle driver has the knowledge, skills, and abilities to operate the vehicle with the attached unit.



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# Planning an Adventure

Guide to Safe Scouting: Transportation

**Except for council-run ATV programs**, All Terrain Vehicles (ATV), Golf Carts, Light Transport Vehicles (LTV's), Utility Transport Vehicles (UTVs), and side-by-sides are banned from program use. This prohibition includes their use at the unit level. [NCAP Standard FA-711](#) provides a standard by which councils and camps may use this equipment.



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# Planning an Adventure

**Texting while driving is more than simply unsafe.**

In 46 states and the District of Columbia, **it's against the law**. That includes all four states that are home to BSA high-adventure bases: Florida, Minnesota, New Mexico and West Virginia.

Talking on a handheld cellphone while driving is banned in 14 states and the District of Columbia. West Virginia — home to the Summit Bechtel Reserve and the 2017 National Jamboree.

# National Youth Leadership Training NYLT



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- **National Youth Leadership Training**

- National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.
- The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what a leader must KNOW, and what a leader must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.
- NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

## Requirements

In order to attend a NYLT course, a youth must have the following qualifications by the beginning of the course:

- Must be a registered member of a Scouting unit.
- Must have a current [BSA Health and Medical Record form parts A, B, and C](#).
- Scouts BSA members must be at least 13 and have achieved First Class rank. They must have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops.
- Venturers and Sea Scouts must have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews or Ships. It is recommended that they have had at least one year of camping experience. While NYLT is not an outdoor skills course, it is important that each participant have basic camping and outdoor cooking experience.
- Have a unit leader recommendation.

## Rangemaster Training

Rangemaster Training- this training will enable you to supervise Cub Scouts for Shooting Sports on Council Properties. The certification is good for **Two (2) years**, and covers safe range procedures for BBs, Archery, Wrist Rockets (sling shots), and Bottle Rockets.

It is a hands-on, outdoor learning experience that places the adult leader in the position of a Scout on a weekend campout. Participants will develop a *lived appreciation* of the challenges faced by a youth learning to lead. This demonstrates numerous options in designing a successful Scouting program for any unit.

When Scoutmaster Position-Specific training and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) have both been completed, new Scoutmasters will have the tools needed to begin an effective Scouting BSA program.
