Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR)

New Form Released

- New AHMR form released in 2020
- 2020 is a transitional year
 - Old form acceptable during 2020
 - New form also acceptable during 2020
- New form MANDATORY beginning Jan 1, 2021
- REMEMBER: Forms are good thru the end of the 12th month after signature

A Few FAQs

- Standardized form for all 50 states
- AHMR should be maintained and shared confidentially
- Parts A and B can be updated at any time if conditions or medications change
- Immunizations follow the recommendations of the CDC.
 Tetanus is the only absolute requirement.
- Exemption forms must be completed for those who do not believe in doctors
- Another form cannot be attached and used in place of the AHMR

Part A of AHMR

- Informed Consent
- Release Agreement
 - Liability
 - Photo



- Authorization to take youth from camp
- Signed by every participant
- Signed by parent/guardian for youth



Part A Specifics

- Informed Consent
 - Acknowledges of risks of BSA activities
 - Acknowledges voluntary participation
 - Emergency contact alternatives
 - Acknowledges consideration of risk and agreement to participate
- Release and waive any and all claims for personal injury, death, or loss of function

Part A Specifics - continued

- Photo Release
- Restrict use of a BB device
 - To comply with California laws
 - A BB device is defined as any instrument that expels a projectile, such as a BB or a pellet, through the force of air
- Participant restrictions
- Signatures with dates
- Youth release from camp

Part B1 Specifics

- Part B still 2 pages, now labeled B1 and B2
- Participant demographics
- Note for photocopy of insurance card
- Emergency contact information
- Health history
 - Be truthful



Part B2 Specifics

- Allergies and Medications
 - Specific sections for
 - Epinephrine autoinjector and rescue inhaler
 - Medications taken



YES

- Authorization for dispensing non-prescription medication
- Approval to administer medication
- Reminder to bring only enough prescription medication for event in original containers; leave 90-day supply at home
- Immunizations
 - Date required, not just saying up to date
 - Exemption form required if not documented
 - Additional information not already covered



Part C of AHMR

- Pre-participation physical exam
- Completed by health care provider
 - Doctor, nurse-practitioner, physician assistant
- Signed by health care provider
- Expires on last day of the 12 month after completed



Part C specifics

- Box Warning Health Care Provider has reviewed supplemental information participant or parent/guardian provided
- Restrictions to participation
- Vital signs and check boxes for exam results
- Examiner's certification
- Height/Weight restrictions for provider's reference
 - Key word in phrase: ...MAY not be allowed to participate



Supplemental Risk Advisory

- Used for some camps and all 4 national high adventure camps
 - Philmont, SeaBase, Northern Tier, Summit
- PADI medical statement needed for scuba participants
- Helps health care provider understand unique risks of the BSA specialty program

When do you need what parts

- All Scouting events lasting less than 72 hours
 Including Den or Patrol activities, Pack, Troop, or Crew Activities, short term Council Events
 - Parts A and B → Participant or parent/guardian can complete
- Events lasting more than 72 hours
 - Including resident camps, NYLT, Wood Badge, tours, treks
 - Parts A, B, and C → Participant, parent/guardian and health care ABC provider complete
- For events lasting less than 72 hours, but with higher risk the camp director may require Parts A, B, and C



Special Notes

- Prescription Medications
 - Responsibility of the individual and/or parent
 - Leaders can agree to make sure youth comply with treatment regiment (NOT mandatory)
 - BSA camps may have standards and policies specific for their program
 - State laws must be followed
- AHMR allows authorization for dispensing non-prescription medication by camp health officer or unit leader as specified on the form

Risk Factors

- Excessive Body Weight
- High Blood Pressure
- Diabetes
- Seizure Disorder
- Asthma
- Sleep Apnea

- Allergies/Anaphylaxis
- Cardiovascular Disease
 Musculoskeletal Injuries
 - Behavioral Health Disorders



Maintaining the AHMR

Guidelines

- Original kept in safe location accessible to leaders
- Take on all activities including travel
- Designate leader to keep AHMR up to date
- Designate a leader to be a point of contact at camp if needed by the camp health officer
- Destroy or return the AHMR when a Scout/Scouter leaves the unit
- Do not digitize
