



This power is evident across all cultural and socioeconomic groups of youth.

One of those 40 developmental assets is **Service to Others** where the child has opportunities to help others in the community. Today, youth and volunteers are looking for ways to serve their communities, and at the same time, service organizations need dedicated volunteer help. By working together, we can positively benefit in the development of young people, our communities, and the nation.



#### **BESTOWED AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS**



#### THE UNIT SCOUTER AWARD

The Unit Scouter Award is an honor bestowed on a registered adult volunteer Scouter who has made a distinguished impact on youth members through outstanding service given at the unit level.

The award is presented annually by the Lake Erie Council in the same manner as the Division Award of Merit and the Silver Beaver Award. What distinguishes it from other bestowed honors is that recipients are recognized for service to Cub Scout packs, Scouts BSA troops, Venturing Crews, or Sea Scout ships.

Nominees must be adult volunteer Scouters who render noteworthy service to youth members in Scouting through a traditional unit. The nature and value of such service may consist of sustained results delivered over a long period of time or a single project, plan or decision impacting many youths over a shorter time.

A committee of fellow volunteers, appointed annually by the Scout Executive, selects nominees for recognition.

Nominations are due by December 15th of each year.

#### **DIVISION AWARD OF MERIT**

The Division Award of Merit is a Lake Eric Council award presented by Divisions in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils. Recipients of this award are registered adult leaders who have made an impact on the lives of youth through service given at the division level.

Nominations are due by January 31st of each year.

#### SILVER BEAVER AWARD

The Silver Beaver Award is the council-level distinguished service award of the Boy Scouts of America. Upon nomination by their local Scout council, recipients of this award are registered adult leaders who have made an impact on the lives of youth through service given to the council. The Silver Beaver is an award given to those who implement the Scouting program and perform community service through hard work, self-sacrifice, dedication, and many years of service.

Nominations are due by December 15th of each year.

#### BEN HAUSERMAN GOOD SCOUT AWARD

The Ben Hauserman Good Scout Award is named after a distinguished and long serving Council Executive Board member, Council President and National BSA volunteer. Ben was a recipient of the Silver Beaver and Silver Buffalo Award. It is a local, council selected award that recognizes an outstanding volunteer who over many years has provided untiring service in the name of Scouting for our council. This is often a Scouter who goes about doing their job not for the recognition, but because it is the right thing to do.
